# Global Village Paper



We have designed a collection of patterns from countries all over the world. Each print is distinctive and representative of a country's heritage. Here are some details:

- Ancient Greek (orange, brown and black). This pattern is found on pottery from Ancient Greece.
- African (black, white and orange). The spirals represent African embroidery.
- English Victorian (turquoise, beige, brown, pink and yellow). A complex and decorative style of artwork from England's Victorian era.
- Japanese (black, red, green and gold). Typical of floral patterns found on boxes and vases.
- Persian Brocade (purple, gold and green). Found in the Middle Eastern carpet work.
- Native North American (blue, red and yellow). Represents ancestral beadwork.
- South American (black, red, blue, purple and green). Animal designs are woven in cloth.
- Chinese (brown, gold, pink and yellow). Birds are found on many Chinese textiles.
- North American (green, blue and purple). Basic quilt pattern.
- Native North American (gold, green, blue and black). Represents wood work.
- Middle East (green, pink, purple, gold and diamonds). A woven pattern.
- Dutch (gold with flowers in stripes of pink, blue, green and brown). Traditional embroidery from Denmark and the Netherlands.

Make global village people with paper dolls dressed in patterned clothing! Decorate **52004 Card Characters**. Lay a paper doll on the back of your patterned paper. Trace the outline of the doll as a guideline. Cut-out clothes with tabs or glue them on the card character. Give your doll a name and write a biography.

Fold an exotic fan! Choose a piece of paper and accordion fold it in and out until you reach the edge of the page. Gather the folds together at one end and tape. Make a variety of different patterned fans. Tip: The rectangular sheets are perfect for fans!

Design a global village greeting card! You can fold one of the rectangular pieces of paper in half to form a card. Write a message inside. Make a collage card! Use a plain piece of cardboard and decorate with many different pieces of paper. Cut out unusual shapes from the patterns and decorate the card. Send a card to a pen pal from another country.
