Stringing Shapes: Stars

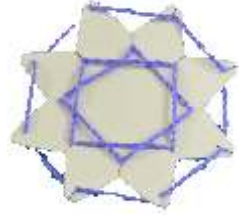
Create beautiful string patterns with these weaving stars!

Technique: Cut approximately 4ft (122 cm) of yarn, string or twine. For very young children, ask them to simply experiment with stringing. This practices fine motor skills and introduces the idea of patterns. For slightly older children, ask them to number the valleys between the points of the star, and to letter the points in alphabetical order. Ask the students to practice following directions by stringing their patterns according to provided instructions. For even older children, once they have practiced with provided pattern instructions, ask them to create their own patterns.

Patterns: A,3,B,4,C,5,D,6,E,7,F,8,G,1,H,2
1,3,4,6,7,1,2,4,5,7,8,2,3,5,6,8,H,A,B,C,D,E,F,G,H
A,D,H,E,B,G,C,F,B,E,A,F,C,H,D,G
A,E,H,D,G,C,F,B
1,5,2,6,3,7,4,8

Ideas: Send students home with beautiful holiday ornaments! Use paint or marker to decorate the star before wrapping string around it. Try using holiday colors or glittery string. Simply tie a loop to your star and hang.

Create a star field in your classroom! Once students have finished creating their stringing patterns, suspend the stars from the ceiling to create constellations or a simple star field. Ask students to use lots of different colors of yarn to make a more colorful display.



Decorate each die cut star with markers, paint or crayons to create a unique, colorful stringing surface!
