

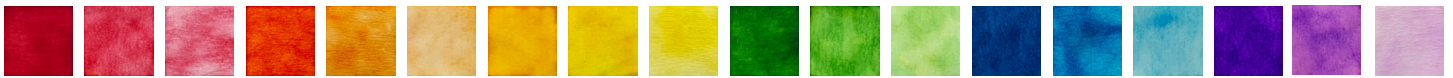


PLUS Water

With **+water**, you can now mix your own Color Diffusing Paint to go along with our HUGE line of Color Diffusing Paper crafts! Our safe, non-toxic, convenient collection of vibrant pigments come in their own fully recyclable plastic bottles for easy, long-lasting storage!

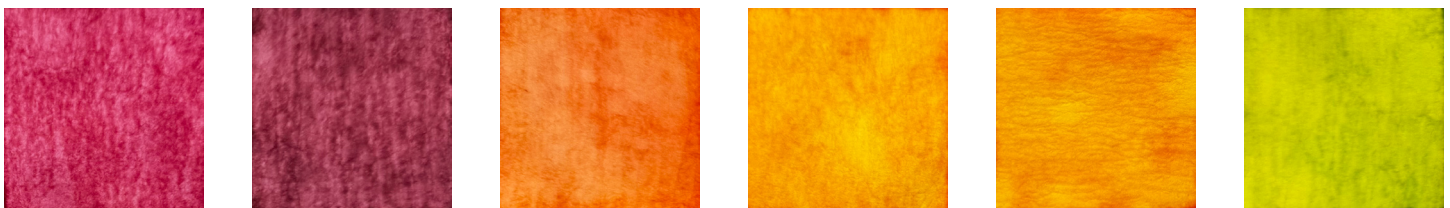
Each bottle comes with enough pigment to create STACKS of watercolor crafts! Just add water and shake! The best part is YOU decide your optimum mixture. Add less water for extremely potent color. Add more water for that “just right” mixture you’re looking for. As your bottle gets used up, add more water back in to extend the color even longer! Just remember, more water means lighter color.

For best results, use a Paint Pipette to pull some of your liquid watercolor mixture out of the bottle and place it in a separate cup for your craft. Then, put the cap back on your **+water** bottle and store it away until you need it next.

Helpful hint: start with a small amount of color. You can always go back for more color if you need it!

Get creative!

You’ll get gorgeous color results right out of the bottle, but you don’t have to stop there. Time to mix some colors! Want a more yellow-orange for some lively sunshine? Need a bluer green for some deep-sea delight? You’re in control! Using a Paint Pipette, drip a little paint into some small paper cups. Mix and match the colors until you find just what you’re looking for! Here’s some examples to get you started:



Red/Violet

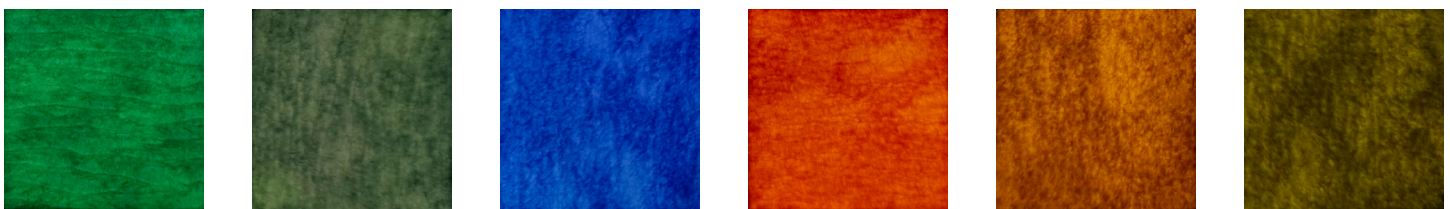
Red/Blue

Remember, the **primary colors** red and yellow make orange, yellow and blue make green, red and blue make purple (violet). Mix the primary colors with the **secondary colors**, orange, green and purple, to create **tertiary colors**, such as red-orange, yellow-orange, yellow-green, blue-green, blue-violet, and red-violet. Mix tertiary colors to make **quaternary colors**. These are good for earth tones, such as olive, maroon or brown.
