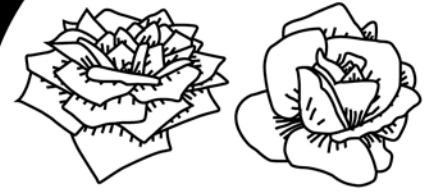

Identification and interesting facts:



Cosmos- The Cosmos comes from the Asteraceae flower family. It can be found from the southern United States to as far south as northern South America.



Iris- The Iris is a genus that consists of more than 200 species of flowers. It is found in Africa, Europe, Asia, the Middle East and North America.



Water lily- The Water lily is also known as Nymphaeaceae. Water lilies are rooted in soil in shallow bodies of water with leaves and flowers floating on the surface.



Morning Glory- The Morning Glory comes from the Convolvulaceae flower family. It is a funnel shaped flower that expands during morning hours to allow for pollination by insects and birds.



Lily- The Lily is also known as the genus Liliium. It consists of nearly 100 species of flowers. Due to their large size and vibrant colors, they are commonly seen in Canada and North America as garden plants.



Rose- The rose comes from the Rosa flower family. There are more than 100 different types of wild roses. They are native to the northern hemisphere in the temperate zones.



Calla Lily- The Calla Lily, also called Zantedeschia, comes from the Araceae flower family. It is naturally in southern Africa.

Marigold- The Marigold, also known as Tagetes, comes from the Asteraceae flower family. It is native to North America, Mexico and South America.



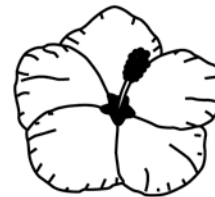
Cactus Flower- The cactus flower is a flower that grown on a cactus known as Echinopsis spachiana. It is native to South America.



Gardenia- The Gardenia comes from the Rubiaceae flower family. It is native to Africa, southern Asia and Australia.



Sunflower- The Sunflower comes from the Asteraceae flower family. The stem of a sunflower can grow up to 10 feet tall. It is native to North, Central and South America.



Hibiscus- The Hibiscus comes from the Malvaceae flower family and is native to warm climates around the world.



Hydrangea- The Hydrangea comes from the Hydrangeaceae flower family. It is native to Japan, China and North and South America.



Tulip- The Tulip comes from the Liliaceae flower family and is native to Africa, Asia, Southern Europe and Iran.



Gazania- The Gazania comes from the Asteraceae flower family and is native to South Africa.
