




Make your own ornaments!

Lay a stencil over cardboard, foam, fabric or even air-dry clay. Trace the design and cut it out. Draw out a design or write a message with white glue and sprinkle glitter on top. When the glue has dried, shake off the extra glitter. Punch a hole in the top of the snowflake and loop ribbon through the hole. Tie the ribbon at the ends and hang it.

Design a festive wall garland.

Lay out several stencils on paper and trace them with a pencil. Cut the snowflakes out and add color with glitter, markers, crayons or paint. Punch a small hole in the top of each snowflake and string them all together. Hang your garland in a window or above a door.

Splendid snowflakes!

Trace snowflakes onto cardstock or chipboard. Cut the patterns out with a craft knife or heavy scissors. Decorate the snowflakes with glitter or paint and give them time to dry.

**Tip:** These stencils include complex shapes. Make sure to hold down the edges while tracing to create uniform lines. For even better results, tape your stencils down on top of your base material and trace.





